IBCI Conference 2007

The Irish Building Control Institute is pleased to present the IBCI Building Control Conference, 2007. The Conference will afford an opportunity for those involved in Building Control throughout the state to consider the effects the proposed new legislation will have on Building Control and the built environment.

The Conference will be held over two days in the **Bunratty Shannon Shamrock Hotel, Bunratty, Co Clare**. Lunch and refreshments will be provided on both days, with the Conference dinner on Thursday evening. A **Trade Exhibition** will also be held in conjunction with the Conference.

Day 1 will include an update on the Building Control Bill 2005 and the proposed changes to Building Control procedures. This will be followed by a technical lecture on fire safety design of dwelling units. The session will end with a look at the topic of Self-Certification, which is currently the subject of much debate. Day 1 concludes with what we hope will be a lively soapbox and question time.

Day 2 commences with a paper on the latest developments in Building Control in the UK and the work of the CEBC. The next presentation will outline the current position with respect to the Energy Rating of Buildings and the proposed timetable for delivery.

The final session will begin with an update on the position of Part M, Access for people with disabilities and Disabled Access Certification (DAC). The session will conclude with a detailed outline on how the Dwellings Energy Assessment Procedure (DEAP) is carried out.
