IBCI Conference 2022

The Irish Building Control Institute is pleased to present the IBCI Building Control Conference, 2022. The Conference will afford an opportunity for those involved in Building Control throughout Ireland to network with their colleagues and receive an update on current developments.

We are delighted to be able to host a live Conference after all the disruption of the last few years due to Covid and we look forward to welcoming you to our live event again.

The Conference will be held over two days in the Radisson Blu Hotel, Sligo. Lunch and refreshments will be provided on both days, with the Conference Dinner on the Wednesday evening. A Trade Exhibition will also be held in conjunction with the Conference.

The focus of this Conference is on the changes in the Building Control System, the Building Regulations and developments including climate action.

Day 1 morning session will include an update on the Building Control legislation/Regulations and updates from the NBCO and NMSO Office. The session concludes with a paper on revisions to Part B and Part M.

After lunch the session will commence with short five-minute slots for the Trade Exhibitors (forty mins max). Next, we address common defects from the perspective of an Assigned Certifier and a Building Control Officers experience including a report on CPR and the Regional Committees. Session concludes with questions and the Soapbox.

Day 2 commences with two papers on the UK situation post the 2017 Grenfell disaster, the Independent Review and the proposed Fire Safety Bill followed by recommendations for improved competencies in Building Control. This is followed by a look at embodied targets for Climate challenge.

After coffee we conclude by looking at three presentations on the tackling of climate change by actions through Building Regulations and Standards.
